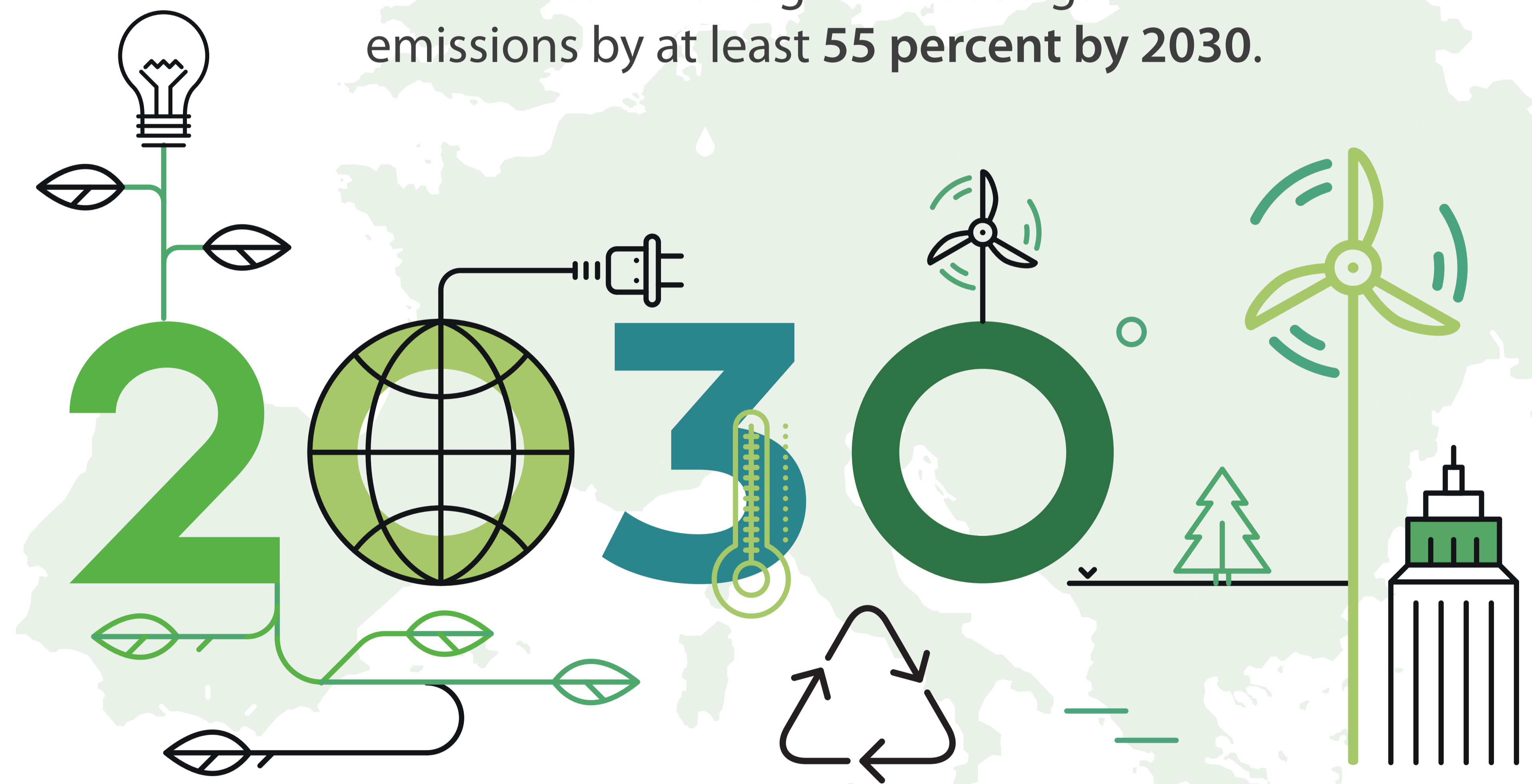


# Let's get green!

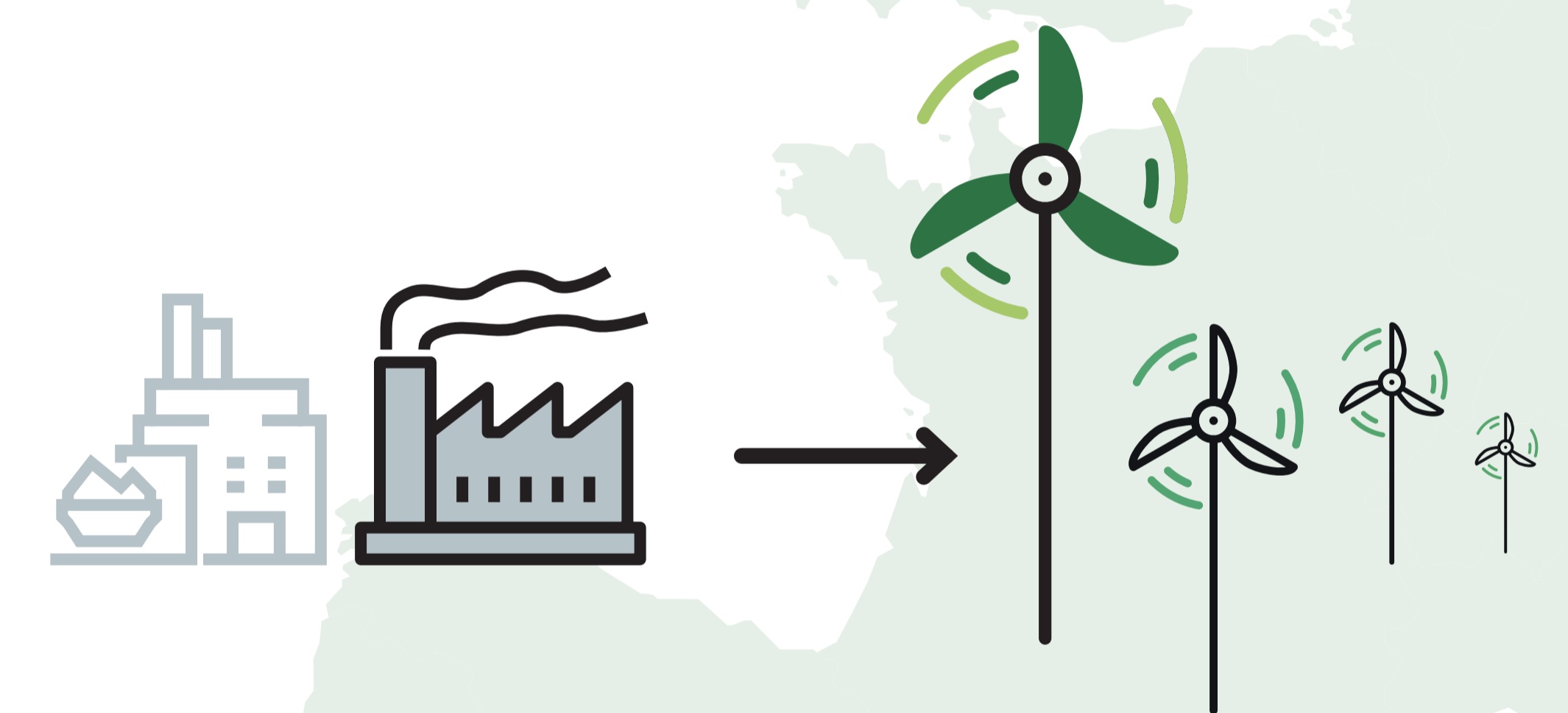

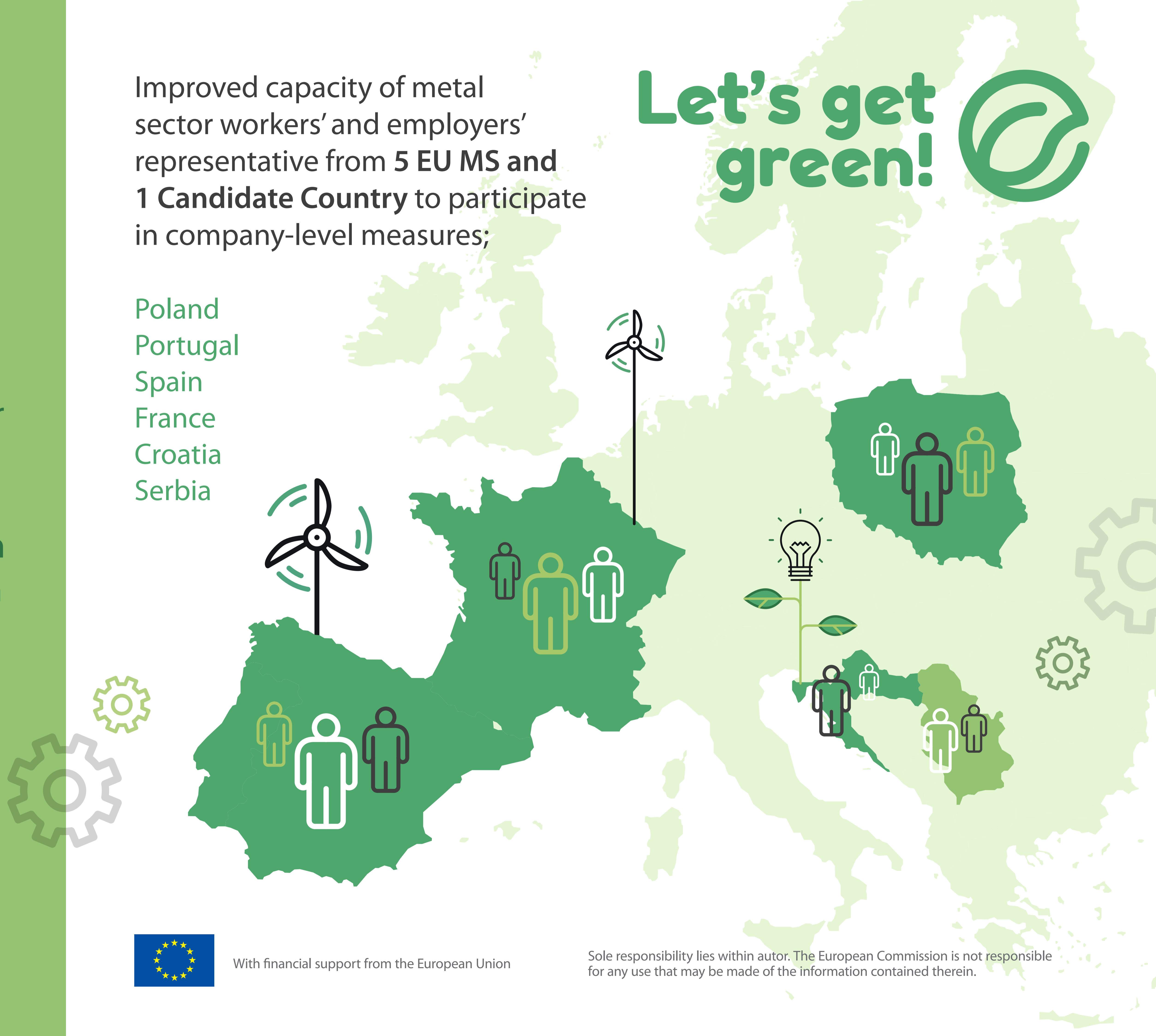
